The Rec Hall gets a face lift for 2007!

Dear Alums,

First of all, we hope you have had a great winter holiday break, and are well on your way to a fun, happy, and fruitful

New Year. Since we find ourselves in February, and we like to have this newsletter to you in January, we apparently need to revisit our New Year's resolution of being more timely with our mailings. We'll try to do better next year.

We have been extremely busy around the office here in Tucson.

Our first session enrollment filled up very quickly this year, and while there are still openings in 2nd session, it looks very strong too. The fall and early winter was time for reunions in several different cities like Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Louis, Tucson, Houston, Nashville, and Denver. We still have trips planned back to Chicago and St. Louis, as well as to Cincinnati to visit with kids, and now our focus is turning squarely to finding the handful of new folks we're going to need to

round out our staff. It looks like a vast majority of the staff from

last summer is going to be back, including a huge number of guys who were campers, then CITs, and are now JCs. They add so much energy and fun to the staff, and we're very fortunate to have so many of them with us again.

The summer of 2006 went by like a flash! In our 22 years at Timberlane, this was clearly the best weather we had ever experienced up there. (We know we said that last year, but who would a thought it could get any better?) It was "Chamber of Commerce" North Woods weather. The days were bright and clear and warm, but rarey was it hot. The nights were cool and crisp, perfect for sleeping. We could have used more precipitation, or "heavy dew" as we refer to it, but towards the latter half of the summer we got enough to green the fields back up, and keep the lake at a healthy level. And most of the wet stuff came down at night, so over the entire summer we only lost about 6 activity periods to Rainy Day programming. It would be asking too much for another summer like that one, but if someone can arrange for us to get close to that, we'd sure appreciate it.

We added another new staff cabin last year to accommodate our increasing number of married staff members. "Seneca" is the new cabin, and it is located on the road that passes between Menominee and Seminole Cabins, then turns left and heads to the Swim Area. It can accommodate 2 couples, each with their own bathrooms, and a chunk of serenity being away from the crowd and back in the forest.

There was a total of 215 camper/trips this past summer, and we anticipate that number to go even higher this year. In camp, we had a great year in all of the activities. Each summer seems to have its own flavor as far as which activities gain in participation, which may decline a bit, etc. Naturally, Skiing remains very strong, and our Timberbats did a spectacular job in their shows

at our camp and the girls' camps they skied for. Rock Climbing is always popular, as is Horseback Riding. Our Baseball, Soccer, and Basketball programs were all very well attended, and in the few games we played with other camps, we rocked! We're still the same of non-competitive place we always were, but our sports instruction has become very strong, and the kids performed accordingly. We're just proud camp directors!

One high point of the summer for us was the return of BILL MILLER to camp for the last 2 weeks of the summer. Bill had been our Head

Charlie was always a huge presence at camp, starting from a very young age. He was bright, athletic, very energetic & gregarious, and had a great sense of humor. He had many, many friends through camp, and as we learned at the Memorial Service in St. Louis, many more at home. Affection for Charlie at camp was notable by the presence of 3 of our staff members who left camp during

the summer to be at his funeral. The Gliks expressed their gratitude for all that camp has meant to Charlie and Billy, and plan to enable a camper scholarship in Charlie's memory.

Looking ahead, we've got a great summer in store for 2007. You may have noticed the beautiful rennovation we have already finished on the Rec Hall. That work was completed this winter, but it is only the beginning. Not only is there new half-log siding and windows that open and close, but we also added on to the building. KTIM will now be located in a room on the front of the Rec Hall, with the ability to provide music for indoor/

outdoor socials, staff shows, etc. We also added a large new room for our Drama program to use for props, costumes, and a "green room." And the interior of the Rec Hall is being overhauled too. It will be finished off, floor to celing, with knotty pine panneling, and a new fold-down stage will be installed on the east wall, across from the fire place. New lighting is going in, and the Rec Hall, while still housing ping, pong, foosball, and other indoor activities, will now be able to host other large scale indoor programs, socials, etc.




