Dear Alums,

There is always some give and take in life. As you get (a little) older, you learn that there are things you gain just as there are things you sorta lose. Perhaps the biggest gain is an increasingly well-developed sense of perspective. We've

had the chance to watch a lot of kids grow up in our years as the directors at Timberlane. And it is our good fortune that we've been able to stay in close contact with several of the people we met when they were little boys way back in 1985 and in the ensuing years. That experience, as well as raising our own kids through pre-school years, grade school years, high school years, and now college years (yikes!), has afforded us the opportunity to make some observations, learn some valuable lessons, and gain an ever-deepening appreciation for the many, many values and attributes that camp provides to those of us fortunate to be a part of it.

The sense of community that is built into camp life is a strength and a grounding influence that is hard to quantify. Having spent 30+ years at Timberlane, and quite a few growing up at other camps, Leslie and I can see so vividly how that has played out in our own lives, and in the lives of other folks we are close to...because of camp, of course. In recent years, we've re-connected or simply stayed connected with so many Timberlane people, and heard from them about how much their camp connections, camp memories, and lessons they learned at camp have shaped their adult lives. Naturally we love hearing about camp folks reaching out to others to offer opportunities and friendship...that's the nectar of life for camp directors! We also know so many former campers who are becoming camp parents, and we love when they tell us how meaningful it is to send their boys to "their" camp and see their sons gain that same sense of community and ownership (check out the list of 2nd & 3rd Generation Campers at the end of this newsletter! Whoah!!). We've heard former counselors tell us how their experiences at camp have played such vital roles in their parenting, and how appreciative they are now for those long hours in Staff Training, and those trying times they had with challenging kids.

So, what does it all mean? We think it means the future is incredibly bright! Our camp community is close, and supportive of each other, and that's so important! As our youngest (Sammy) goes off to college next year, and our oldest (Dustin) graduates next December and joins us full time after the summer of 2016, we see great strength, great fun, and great adventures ahead for our whole camp community. We all draw so much from our shared experiences – from generation to generation – and as it becomes increasingly clear how vital the skills that we gain at camp are to 21st Century careers and relationships (problem solving & critical thinking, communication & collaboration, leadership), we're confident that camp experiences at Timberlane

and around the country are contributing to the growth of one young generation after another. As we find ourselves saying more and more frequently, "There ain't no app for that!"

We had an epic summer last year. One of the characteristics that shaped it was the fact that we had the largest PA group in all of our years at camp. In fact, the PAs (oldest age group for those of you who may not recall) represented 25% of the camp! They occupied 3 cabins in the Senior Village both sessions. The PAs can, most summers, really shape the whole atmosphere of camp. If they're fun, accepting, and enthusiastic, that's the kind of summer we'll have. They were, and we did! They were great campers, adventurous and fun, they kept an eye out for and took an interest in our younger guys, and the end result was a happy, friend-filled, and very adventurous 8 weeks. We even scouted and started running a new river for us last summer, sending several trips down the Ontonagon River in the Upper Peninsula.

We hope to scout a few other rivers for possible trips this coming summer.

If you didn't hear, the big lake, Lake Superior, didn't fully thaw until July last year, thanks to the crazy winter weather. That meant we had an unusually cool start to the summer, and though it did warm up nicely, we remained below normal in our temps for most of the season. Honestly, it didn't slow us down a bit. It was nice avoiding those extra hot summer days, and fortunately our lake warmed up early so hopping into the friendly waters of Lake Towanda was nice.

We had some nice improvements around camp, most notably the final renovation on our spectacular climbing tower. When we initially built the 70 footer, 2 of the climbing sides were plywood surfaces with various bolt-on features to add some variety and challenge. In the years since, climbing gym technology has boomed, and we have taken advantage of that. We replaced one of those sides a few years ago with a new synthetic rock surface, and last year we replaced the other wood side with a brand new, state-of-the-art climbing surface. The tower is now a true piece of art, standing tall on the far athletic field, and it presents a myriad of climbing experiences and challenges. We now have an easy-access, walk-out rappelling station at the top of the tower, and when you add in the huge indoor bouldering cave right next to the tower, you can just imagine how unparalleled our program has become.

We're proud of the facility, of course, but we're equally proud of our staff who teach climbing and pass their passion on to the kids. And, it is worth noting, that we can credit much of that to alumnus **STUART COWLES**, who joins us every year to train our trip leaders and in-camp instructors in rock climbing. Stuart owns a climbing gym, backpack company, and climbing guide service in Asheville, NC. He's busy finishing construction on his newest facility, the Smokey Mountain Adventure Center in Asheville, but even with his hands so full, he will again make the time available to come up north and spend a week with us training our staff. Amazing.

SAM SENTONGO made the Superintendent's List at the US Air Force Academy.


MINDY WIPER passed through Tucson this winter on her way to Houston. She has finished her work at Nature Bridge near Yosemite, and will train horses closer to home.
